CPR on board ships

First Aider

Check consciousness:

Speak, shake

If unconscious:

- Call for help and mobile resuscitation equipment
- Secure free airways
- Bend the head back and lift up the chin
- Observe, feel and listen for breathing for no more than 10 seconds

Unconscious and no breathing/gasping breathing:

- Place both hands on the centre of the chest
- Begin CPR:

30 compressions and 2 ventilations

Depth of pressure: at least 5 cm - no more than 6 cm.

Pressure frequency: at least 100 compressions per minute - no more than 120 compressions per minute.


The 2 ventilations must take no longer than 5 seconds.

If possible, replace the person who performs CPR every 2 minutes

 If an AED is available, perform CPR until electrodes are placed. Hereafter, follow AED's instructions














If **breathing is normal** and you have to leave the person unattended, place him/her into stable/recovery position

Paramedic

Check consciousness:

Speak, shake

If unconscious:

- Call for help and mobile resuscitation equipment
- Secure free airways
- Bend the head back and lift up the chin
- Observe, feel and listen for breathing for no more than 10 seconds

Unconscious and no breathing/ gasping breathing:

- Place both hands on the centre of the chest
- Begin CPR:

30 compressions and 2 ventilations through ventilation bag with added oxygen, 15 litres per minute Depth of pressure: at least 5 cm - no more than 6 cm.

Pressure frequency: at least 100 compressions per minute - no more than 120 compressions per minute The 2 ventilations must take no longer than 5 seconds

If possible, replace the person who performs CPR every 2 minutes

- If an AED is available, perform CPR until electrodes are placed. Hereafter, follow AED's instructions
- Contact Radio Medical when possible
