

Maritime Life Support

Overview	What is the problem? Story – Symptoms – Medicine
A Airways	 Check free airways Positioning according to problem Give oxygen
B Breathing	 See - chest movement - raise and fall (Remove clothe) Listen - sounds when breathing, obstructed, gurgling or normal? (listen when talking) Feel – on cheek when going close to mouth/nose Assess frequency and depth (fast/shallow, slow, deep, normal)
C Circulation	 Check capillary response (more or less than 2 sec?) Feel the quality of the pulse (fast/weak, normal/hard) Check skin color (pale/bluish/red) and temperature (cold/warm/sweaty/cold sweats) Secure major bleedings Contact to Radio Medical is a possibility at this time
D Disability	 Examine and assess level of consciousness (1-4) Examine pupils reaction to light
E Expose	 Top to toe examination of the patient in relation to symptoms Further examination and treatment in close cooperation with Radio Medical
Secondary actions	 Reassess ABC if changes occur Write the Radio Medical Record and monitor vital signs Contact Radio Medical Continue close observation of the patient and perform ordinary first aid Perform the prescriptions from Radio Medical

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
