



Guidelines for support vessels

Support vessels' outfitting with medicaments (annex 1) can be equated to the following.

The company is responsible for drawing up first aid procedures in accordance with the function as a support vessel.

The crew should be trained in accordance with the procedures. The master must, as a minimum, hold a certificate in medical care, cf. Notice A from the Danish Maritime Authority.

First aid procedures

- Procedure for warming hypothermic patients
- Procedure for treating burns
- Procedure for removing oil and chemical from human beings
- Procedure for high-energy traumas
- Procedure for prioritising many injured persons.

The list above should be supplemented by other relevant first aid procedures in accordance with the functions of the ship.

Sickbays

Sickbays are arranged in accordance with the requirements for sickbays stipulated in Notice B from the Danish Maritime Authority in consideration of the number of persons that the ship is approved for taking on board.

Medicine chest

In the Danish continental shelf area, the vessel's medicine chest must correspond to the Danish medicine chest B MFAG B. The minimum quantity of medicine should be in consideration of the number of persons that the ship is approved for taking on board.

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
